We gather this weekend to celebrate the Nineteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time. The readings are 1 Kings 19:4-8, Ephesians 4:30-5:2 and John 6:41-51. Elisha is having a rough day, he fought a battle with all the false prophets of Israel and won but now is running for his life. He fell asleep under a tree and woke up to find food for his journey to the mountain of God. St. Paul is reminding us of our great dignity as children of God. He is reminding us to live a life worthy of so great a calling. He is telling us to be an imitator of God as his beloved children. In the Gospel today Jesus is telling us that he is the bread that came down from heaven: The Messiah. The crowd is trying to figure it out because they know where he is from; they are asking how can this be? Jesus is telling them to stop murmuring and listen and believe in what I am telling you. He is the bread from heaven and if we eat this bread we will have eternal life. What a wonderful promise made to each of us. Our God is with us on our journey through life and sends us aids along the way to help us stay faithful to his message of love.

The Holy Day of the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is on Thursday, August 15th. Mass times at Holy Name are on Wednesday, August 14th at 5:30 pm and on Thursday, August 15th at 8:30 am. There will be a Mass at Holy Rosary on August 15th at 6 pm. This Mass is also a Pastorate event with food and games after Mass in Kranzburg.

The Parish Office will be closed on August 15th.

On August 14th we honor St. Maximillian Kolbe, Priest and Martyr. His is the first person to be declared a saint from those who died in the death camps of the Second World War. St. Maximillian was a priest in Poland and after the Germans invaded, he was arrested and sent to a death camp called Auschwitz. He offered his life for another man who was a husband and father, this man was condemned to death by starvation. Maximillian took his place. After two weeks with no food and water he was murdered by the Nazi's. He was canonized as a saint in 1982. Maximillian was known for his charity and mercy to others. He had a great love for the Blessed Mother and died on the eve of the Assumption in 1941. Pray and ask St. Maximillian for the courage he had to stand fast for your faith.

TIDBITS OF OUR CATHOLIC FAITH

What is St. Michael's Lent?

Have you ever heard of this beautiful devotion that honors St. Michael?

“St. Michael's Lent” is a beautiful devotion in honor of St. Michael the Archangel. It is a forty-day period of fasting, prayer, and penance—a miniature Lent, you might say—that runs from the Feast of the Assumption on August 15th to the great archangel's feast day on September 29th. This devotion comes to us from the life of St. Francis of Assisi, who was deeply devoted to St. Michael and the angels. He practiced this “Lent” himself, as mentioned in St. Bonaventure's famous biography of him and in *The Little Flowers of St. Francis*, a collection of stories about the early Franciscans.

St. Michael's Lent, in fact, forms the backdrop to one of the most famous events in the life of St. Francis. A couple years before his death, the saint was inspired to spend St. Michael's Lent on a certain mountain called La Verna. Here, close to the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross (September 14th), he received the wounds of Our Lord's Passion in his own body: the stigmata. The Franciscans celebrate St. Francis' reception of the stigmata with a feast on September 17th.

St. Michael's Lent, like the original Lent, excludes Sundays (and, we presume, feast days—there aren't strict rules since it is a devotion rather than an obligation).

We should all foster devotion to St. Michael, our great helper and defender in our battle with the devil. Practicing St. Michael's Lent is a great way to do it—but don't be intimidated, you can practice it in whatever way and to whatever extent you can! Even a little given with love and devotion has measureless value in the eyes of God and His angels.
