We gather this weekend to celebrate the Thirteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time. The readings are Wis 1:13-15, 2:23-24, 2 Cor 8:7, 9, 13-15, Mk 5:21-43 or 5:21-24, 35-43. In the first reading we are being told that God made us for himself. He is the eternal God, and he shares that gift of forever with us. Evil cannot take that gift away from us. In our second reading Paul was in Corinth trying to raise money for the mother church in Jerusalem. The church in Jerusalem was under persecution and had no money to help the poor. The Corinthians thought this was great idea but never did anything about it. Paul then tried to appeal to their Christian charity and asked them to share their abundance with the church in Jerusalem and if they should ever have a need, the church in Corinth would be helped, he was sharing God's message that all should be equal, no one should have more or less than the other. Mark's Gospel today reflects a pattern in the ministry of Jesus: proclamation, opposition, restoration. We can even see his life, death, and resurrection as the model for this pattern. Jesus proclaimed the Good News, was opposed by the leaders unto death, and was restored to his rightful place as the only Son of the Father. He promises the same for us. Today, ponder and give thanks for the many ways in which God has helped you throughout your life.

TIDBITS OF OUR CATHOLIC FAITH



The young Spanish nobleman had the world at his feet.

He had riches, a renowned family, a noble name. He had education and opportunity. He was a page of the King. He had a glorious future ahead of him among the most prestigious personages in the kingdom.

But it wasn't enough.

Aloysius desired a pearl of far greater worth than any worn at the royal court. A pearl that belonged to a heavenly Kingdom.

This pearl would cost all his earthly possessions. Indeed, it would claim his whole life. But he gave it willingly, joyfully, bravely.

Aloysius Gonzaga was born in 1568 to a powerful noble family in Castiglione, Spain. Of a profoundly pious disposition, he practiced a life of intense prayer and mortification even from childhood. He studied in Italy and received his First Communion from St. Charles Borromeo.

At the age of thirteen he was sent to the court of Philip II in Spain, where he was a true lily among thorns. Amidst the corruption and immorality of court life, he was untouched by it, persevering heroically in virtue, prayer, and sanctity.

As a young man of nobility, he was expected to follow a life of worldly accomplishment. But he had other ideas—*he wanted to join the Jesuits!* He had to overcome the opposition of his family, but at last he was allowed to renounce his inheritance and enter the order he desired in Rome at age seventeen. Here the novice needed no reminders about keeping up his devotions and austerities and was a brilliant student. He studied under another saint, St. Robert Bellarmine, who would later promote Aloysius' beatification.

Aloysius was still a seminarian when the plague struck Italy, and devoted himself to the care of the sick. He contracted it himself and died on June 21st, 1591 at the age of twenty-three, a model for young people everywhere. He is the patron saint of students and is buried in the magnificent church of San Ignazio in Rome, along with his teacher, St. Robert Bellarmine.

All young Catholics are called to devote their lives to Our Lord as St. Aloysius did. St. Aloysius should be an inspiration to all, especially our young people.

On a live television interview, the subject was forgiveness, and the reading was Romans 3:23, "for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." One of the panel said, "Thanks be to God who delivers us from our falling shorts."
