

#### Spiritual Reflection on Today's Gospel

The famous Russian novelist Fyodor Dostoyevsky said, "Love in action is a harsh and dreadful thing." In the Gospel reading this week, Jesus does something harsh and dreadful — he watches his own disciples abandon him. What could possibly be loving about that?

Well, we notice the context is Jesus' teaching about eating and drinking his body and blood. His followers hear this and say, "This teaching is difficult; who can accept it?" (John 6:60). We shouldn't imagine we'd do anything different, because not even the ones who stay, like Peter, seem to understand what Jesus is saying. Then we hear this devastating line, "Because of this many of his disciples turned back and no longer went about with him" (John 6:66). Besides the night of the Last Supper, only now do Jesus' disciples abandon him. And, painfully, Jesus just lets them go.

The best way to make sense out of this is love. Jesus is God's love in action. He wants to become one with those whom He loves. He wants to love them as His own body. Yes, the oneness manifested in the Eucharist sounds harsh and dreadful because it is rooted in love which is willing to risk abandonment and separation to attain its goal: to be one body with the beloved. It is both terrifying and wonderful that Jesus will risk losing us in order to be one with us. Our response? Lord, we cannot grasp a love so great, but please help us never to abandon it, either.

### **Helping Families Get Ready for School**

Back to school is a time of new beginnings.

This time also brings curiosity, anxiety and excitement. It would seem strange if it were not at least a bit stressful. Changes can be overwhelming but they don't need to be. Think of a time when you previously helped your child through transitions; what worked?

Does your child warm up to new situations quickly or does it take a while? Dealing with the unknown may present some kids with concerns. Here are a few ways to ease any worries that your child may have.

- •Fear of the unknown: Answer as many questions as you can. Seek out information from the school's website or a teacher's blog. Visit school together, make an appointment or attend the open house if one is held.
- •Separation anxiety: Put something in your child's pocket to remind them of home (a small round stone or little piece of cloth). Read books and talk about other times when parents are away but always come back.
- •Make school shopping fun; let them have a decision in what to buy.
- •Start morning and bedtime routines at least one week prior (although some children may need longer, you know your child best).
- •Prepare the night before: lay out clothes, fill backpacks and make lunches. Encourage children to help with all these tasks.
- •Recognize that middle-schoolers may have concerns as well such as being late to class, too much homework, locker problems, being too different or no friends. Address these concerns, offer reassurances, seek out answers and make a plan to check back with them in a few days or next week to see how it feels now.

## GUIDE TO PRAYING THE ROSARY (Scan the QR Code to view the Rosary Guide online at www.kofc.org)



#### How to Pray the Rosary

- Begin by making the Sign of the Cross.
- 2) Holding the crucifix, pray the Apostles' Creed.
- 3) On the first bead, pray the Our Father.
- On the next three beads, pray the Hail Mary.
- On the last bead, pray the Glory Be.
- 6) Announce the first mystery and pray one Our Father, 10 Hail Marys and the Glory Be. The Fatima Prayer is optional.
- Repeat until the five decades are prayed.
- 8) Pray the Hail, Holy Queen.
- 9) Finish by making the Sign of the Cross.

#### Sign of the Cross

In the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

#### Apostles' Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

#### **Our Father**

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us, and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.
